LET'S GET EFFICIENT

- Use Microsoft 365 Business Apps (includes ITB of OneDrive)
 - Don't need to remote into work computers for files or transfer files with a USB thumb drive
 - Create folders to share with associates to access
 - Files are available anytime and anywhere
 - Files are update and current at all times
 - Access files (OneDrive) from any and all devices
 - Stay away from free accounts
 - OneDrive now has the ability sync (backup) Desktop, Documents and Pictures



LET'S GET EFFICIENT

- Use Networkable printers and scanners (multi-function)
 - Users can print to any printer
 - Digitize (scan) important documents
- > Buy business class hardware, routers, access points, switches, etc.
- Use some form of a daily cloud backup that keeps versioning for an extended period of time. This can save you by being able to restore an accidently deleted folder or files, lost or stolen laptop or ransomware. Setup a confirmation that the backup completed or failed.

LET'S GET EFFICIENT

> Take a class......



- > Setup 2FA (Two-Factor Authentication) for all cloud/web services
 - If someone steals you login password, they can't login because of the second authentication required.
- ➤ Lock your devices, using the security lock option to lock phones, tablets and computers. Set security screen lock to 1 to 3 minutes.
- Use strong passwords. Use a different password for each website. Most require a least 8 characters, upper and lower case, number and a symbol. Do not save passwords in your web browser.



- Use a password manager like LastPass, Keeper, Dashlane, etc. to securely store all your passwords to multiple websites. You just need to remember "one master password"
- Type the website's address (URL) and then save the bookmark. Don't search for a company's support phone number. Go to their exact website and find the proper number
- Never trust the Wi-Fi in a public location. Do not perform any banking, financial transactions including entering your credit card
 to purchase something.

- > Stay away from posting Personal Identifiable Information (PII) on social media platforms. Hacker's love this.....
- > Freeze your Credit Reports (the big three)

- > Keep your software up to date
 - Turn on automatic system updates for your device
 - Make sure your desktop web browser uses automatic security updates
- If you're using a laptop that has any confidential information on it, the hard drive should be encrypted with Microsoft BitLocker. If laptop is stolen or lost, data can't be accessed unless they have the computer password.



> Never click on links or open attachments in suspicious e-mails. When in doubt, throw it out!

 \triangleright Never call an (800) support number from something that pops up on your computer screen. And never, never, never allow a stranger to remote into your computer.

Install Antivirus and keep it up to date.
